NCSC Practice Materials Assessment Script for Sight Translation 1 with Keywords

On 2/10/2020, Officers Sawyers and Talmut responded to an <u>emergency</u>¹ call at <u>5102 Oxford St</u>², Apartment 115 in reference to a possible <u>overdose</u>³.

Upon arrival, Jefferson County Fire and Rescue was on the <u>scene</u>⁴ providing treatment to Harold Smithy. EMTs <u>advised</u>⁵ the officers that Mr. Smithy was being <u>treated</u>⁶ for alcohol <u>poisoning</u>⁷ and/or a drug overdose. He was in <u>stable condition</u>⁸, but as a <u>precautionary</u>⁹ measure was being transported to Bayfront Hospital for further medical assessment.

Officers¹⁰ then made contact with a female who was inside Mr. Smithy's apartment:

Sandy Olsen. When questioned, Ms. Olsen told the officers to "go to hell¹¹" and was generally hostile¹². Upon further questioning¹³, Ms. Olsen revealed that she and Mr. Smithy had been drinking all day when Mr. Smithy walked over to the couch and collapsed¹⁴ in a prone¹⁵ position. Mr. Smithy was having difficulty breathing and began to seize¹⁶, so Ms. Olsen called 911.

Officers attempted to speak to Mr. Smithy, but he was unable to <u>communicate</u>¹⁷ due to his <u>inebriated</u>¹⁸ state. Inside the apartment, officers observed <u>in plain sight</u>¹⁹ two small Ziplock <u>baggies</u>²⁰ containing a handful of <u>blue</u>²¹ pills in each.

The two baggies of suspected <u>narcotics</u>²² were <u>impounded</u>²³ at the Jefferson County Police Station <u>Property and Evidence Unit</u>²⁴ for <u>processing</u>²⁵ as evidence.
