[“I couldn’t be happier” Pima County Drug Court program celebrate graduation](#)

For over fifteen years, David Przybylowski has been on a journey to find freedom from addiction. Today, he found success as he graduated from the [Pima County Drug Court program](#) or Pima County Attorney’s Office Drug Treatment Alternative to Prison program.

“It was a decision between prison and this,” he said. “Prison actually seemed easier than this, but I have a family to live for.”

The program lasts for up to three years, focusing on rehabilitation and recovery. The program also offers wraparound services from housing vouchers to counseling and a collaboration with local community-based treatment providers. Przybylowski said it was difficult at first to take the step into recovery, but it was worth it.
