Group looked at responses to Municipal Court questions on the City's Citizen Satisfaction Survey and took a first look at the National Center for State Courts Access and Fairness Survey.

Court User Survey

Will run for 1 week instead of 1 day to cover greater cross section of our court users

- Week of May 6 through 10 (goal)
- We will tailor the Access and Fairness Survey. Some things we need to add:
 - Courtroom
 - Under access: parking, access to bus route
 - Ability to find a public defender/Legal Aid information
- Will be administered by court staff and/or members of this committee.
 - There will need to be guidelines and training.
 - Watch biases when approaching people.
 - Surveyors should be approachable, friendly, reliable and from a diverse cross-section
- Inclusion of Municipal Court inmates: We will survey those on the in-custody docket
- Will need English and Spanish language surveys
- We should have interpreter for commonly encountered languages. Luis Cordoba agreed to help with this.
- If someone cannot read surveyor can offer to read it for them
- We should keep survey brief
- Possible incentives for completion: \$5 food gift card; slices of pizza; raffle entry for Royal's tickets
- While we may want some open-ended questions, they may need to be optional with an extra incentive for answering (possibly the raffle).
- Contact information: Optional page that is separated from survey so people feel free to answer truthfully.
 Would be used to directly receive survey results; invite to community engagement forums; allow national pilot project follow-up.
