 Heard that there is a possibility that major opioid retailers, such as CVS, Walgreens and Walmart will settle in the first quarter of 2023. However even if it does occur and the state of Wisconsin approves the settlement, the county administrator is foreseeing it as a long, drawn-out process. When the county finally secures funds from the settlement, [County Administrator Jeff French] said the funds would likely be used to get a drug court back together like the county once had.
