What: NCSC Online Survey


When: December 9-12, 2024

Who: Conducted by GBAO Strategies

Polled: 1,000 Registered Voters

Margin of Error: +/= 3.1% (19 times out of 20)

// KEY **FINDINGS**



Public trust in state courts is showing small gains for the second year in a row.



For the fourth year in a row, state courts are earning a **stronger job approval rating**.



Few see state courts providing help for self-represented litigants (SRLs), with most respondents supporting a proposal to license Allied Legal Professionals (ALPs).




Respondents expressed

Q: "How much confidence do you have in each institution?"


Percent saying they have either a great deal of confidence or some confidence.




Demographic divides in opinion persist.

Q: "How much confidence do you have in each institution?"


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


Q: "Please indicate whether you agree or disagree with the statement."




// FIGURE 3B ...While other attributes provoke negative reactions.

Q: "Please indicate whether...each of the following words or phrases describes (state) courts well/not well."




// FIGURE 4 Job approval is on the rise.

Q: "How would you rate the job being done by courts in (state)?"




A majority see courts providing easy access to public records.

Q: "Courts in (state) make it easy to access public documents and records."






Q: "Which of the following statements comes closest to your own view, even if neither is exactly right?"






